Relations. Hedi Ago is transitioning from VP of Member Relations to President Elect and will be transitioning into the President position as of 01/01/2013.

We will be doing a lessons learned of our 2011 election process. Things that went well: high participation and no vacant positions. Things that can be improved: timing for elections (considering moving elections from December to February; *Roles and Responsibilities of Elections Committee and current involvement of the active Board. There is a fine line between taking an active role which could generate problems with an unbiased process (bylaws) and letting things run without involvement and risking staffing issues.*

We continue to work hard towards our first PMICFC Symposium. We have secured Dr. Kerzner as our Key Note Speaker. *The symposium will take place on April, 12-13 at the beautiful Marriot World Center in Downtown. Registration is open and we already have attendees registered.*

We will have a busy January with board transitions, budget approval and getting ready for several events: Happy Hour, Lunch and Learn, Traci Duez in February. *Our membership continues to be strong with a low attrition rate and new membership numbers. We will be focusing on membership in 2012 with several programs that will include schools, universities and business.*

The PMI-Northeast Florida chapter ended the year on a high note with our December board of directors meeting and thank you luncheon at Maggiano's Restaurant. Our 2011 President Brian Phillips thanked the 2011 board members for their excellent support to the chapter in 2011. He also welcomed several new 2012 board members who were able to join for the occasion.

Through the 11 dinner meetings this year, five of them offered 2 PDUs. One of them also had an afternoon session for PMs in transition for another 1.5 PDU and we gave the follow-up 2 PDU dinner meeting attendees a CD which offered yet another PDU. Attending dinner meetings alone, there were 17 PDUs available. Membership grew from 549 to 632.

2011 was a very good year for the PMI-Savannah River Chapter. We placed our priorities on the

Organization first, PMI HQ and then the community.

The Organization (PMI-SR Chapter):

- * We reinvented our Website by collaborating with Proteon. This allowed us to register and pay for our business meetings in advance.

- * We reinvented our business meeting. A few of the highlights were as follows:

- Added a safety moment that included a contest and prize
- Shifted to a buffet style meal that included multiple entrees and multiple visits to the hot food
- Added a PMP preparation Question and Answer session to every meeting in which everyone at each table participated and a star was affixed to the badge of the winners (This session created added excitement to the room due to the competitive nature of PMs. In addition, collaboration skills were being practiced due to each table only getting one answer. It was observed that some individuals looked for mentors to sit with so they would win. Lastly, even the non-PM visitors would get excited if they helped get the right answer.)

- Table prizes that included movie tickets or other prizes were at every table and were presented at the end of every meeting

- All BODs were requested, during the year, to tell about their duties to encourage others to participate

- Our average attendance was 50 members and guests (a new high)

- We replaced outdated computer and audiovisual equipment

- * We invented a recognition coin, "GOOD PROJECT MANAGEMENT PRACTICE" that was presented to new PMPs, volunteers, speakers, and co-workers that were seen demonstrating or executing good project management practices. Approximately 75 were handed out during the year.

- * We celebrated PM cognizance by rewarding the star recipients with a prize commensurate with the number of stars earned at the end of the year meeting.

- * We held a Holiday Party event in November (first ever) to encourage comradery in which Appreciation Certificates were handed out for "meeting participation, mentoring, subcommittee contributions, and practicing good project management practices.

- * Set up tours for the membership to visit the new construction of Nuclear Plant Vogtle Units 3 and 4.

- * Presented the benefits of the Local PMI Chapter and PMI HQ to a group of PMs at a large 12,000+ Military Base (Fort Gordon) in Augusta, Ga. 15 PMs attended. Discussions are continuing.

- * Our organization grew to 190 members (a new high).

- * We developed a marketing brochure for Sponsorship in our Chapter and then pursued several industries for sponsorships. Received two sponsorships for a total of \$6,000. Mentorship, advertisement, PMP Prep class discounts and meal discounts were offered to the sponsors.

PMI-HQ:

- * We offered and conducted two PMP Preparation Classes to the local industry. We had no less than 10 volunteers to offer their time and experience to teach these classes.

- * The Regional Leader was requested to speak for the first time to the chapter with great results. A connection to HQs was made.

- * The Bylaws were updated and submitted to HQ with an energetic volunteer team.

- * The "GOOD PROJECT MANAGEMENT PRACTICE" recognition coin was shared with HQs.

- * Several anonymous members participated in the HQ survey on the Chapters performance in many areas. We found the feedback to be extremely valuable for future planning.

- * Sent representatives to the Region 14 Conference and North American World Congress.

- * Numerous questions were asked of HQs. All questions were answered promptly and accurately.

The Community:

- * The first ever Local Chapter PMI Project of the Year trophy was awarded to a local business for practicing PM principles. A Runner Up project also received a trophy. An article was written up about the award at a large business complex with 8,000 workers that highlighted the Chapter's activities.

- * We selected the award recipient of a \$1,000 college scholarship.

- * We presented a \$250 "Best Project Management Practices" award at a local "Future City" middle school

competition.

* We supported the United Way for the 10th straight year at the Shiloh Community Center in Augusta, Ga. Work included maintenance of the facility and yard care.

* We completed project management support of the Phase I modifications to the Jessye Norman School of Arts in Augusta, Ga. as a pro-bono activity.

* We assisted in the planning for Phase II modifications to the Jessye Norman School of Arts by issuing a Communications Plan and having a volunteer team on standby when grant funds become available to begin the project.

* We evaluated the repair of the famous James Brown automatic camera system located in downtown Augusta, Ga. that became inoperable due to technology issues. Planning is underway to repair the system.
